











## Anti-Racism Book Bundles for Primary

 <p><b>Race Cars – A Children’s Book About White Privilege</b> by Devenny</p>	<p>2016</p>	<p><i>Race Cars</i> is a children's book about white privilege. It was created to serve as a springboard for parents and educators to facilitate tough conversations with their children about race, privilege and oppression.  <i>Race Cars</i> tells the story of 2 best friends, a white car and a black car, that have different experiences and face different rules while entering the same race.  The author is a social worker and child/adolescent psychotherapist.</p>
 <p><b>I Promise</b> by James</p>	<p>2020</p>	<p><i>I Promise</i> is a lively and inspiring picture book that reminds us that tomorrow’s success starts with the promises we make to ourselves and our community today. It features vibrant illustrations perfectly crafted for a diverse audience.</p>
 <p><b>Your Name is a Song</b> by Thompson-Bigelow</p>	<p>2020</p>	<p>Frustrated by a day full of teachers and classmates mispronouncing her beautiful name, a little girl tells her mother she never wants to come back to school. In response, the girl's mother teaches her about the musicality of African, Asian, Black-American, Latinx, and Middle Eastern names. Empowered by this newfound understanding, the young girl is ready to return the next day to share her knowledge with her class. <i>Your Name is a Song</i> is a celebration to remind all of us about the beauty, history, and magic behind names.</p>
 <p><b>Little Leaders: Bold Women in Black History</b> by Harrison</p>	<p>2017</p>	<p>Features 18 trailblazing bold black women whose actions and beliefs contributed to making the world better for generations of girls and women to come.</p>

 <p><b>Mixed A Colorful Story</b> by Chung</p>	2018	<p>Acceptance/unity. The reds, the yellows and the blues all think they're the best in this vibrant, thought-provoking picture book from Arree Chung, with a message of acceptance and unity.</p>
 <p><b>I Am Every Good Thing</b> by Barnes and James</p>	2020	<p>The confident Black narrator of this book is proud of everything that makes him who he is. He's got big plans, and no doubt he'll see them through--as he's creative, adventurous, smart, funny, and a good friend. Sometimes he falls, but he always gets back up. And other times he's afraid, because he's so often misunderstood and called what he is not.</p>
